Advocate

Advocating for the advancement of the profession through mentorship

We will:

- Establish a working group of active and aspiring IBCLCs to build mentorship opportunities for aspiring IBCLCs to get clinical hours through Pathway 3
- Identify specific needs of potential mentors and mentees that MLCA Mentoring Committee can assist with.
- Recruit and support members who can offer mentorship.
- Strongly focus on supporting

- Assist members and mentees in completing a portion of their hours via telehealth



Build

Build professional recognition through substantial outreach to providers and organizations that work with families during the childbearing year

We will:

- Increase outreach to collaborative providers on prenatal education, availability of IBCLCs in their communities, and IBCLC scope of practice.
- Rebuild our website to reflect the professionalism of our organization and our membership
- Update our provider directory and highlight members quarterly on the website and in our newsletter.
- Add pages for providers and parents to access evidence-based information on lactation while also updating our current members-only section to be a more robust resource for our members.



Supporting the professional needs of our members during and beyond the COVID-19 pandemic

We will:

- Recruit members and collaborative providers to form an Access Committee focused on increasing access to IBCLC care for families with Mass Health insurance
- Research plans of action from other states that have been succesful in securing Medicaid payment for IBCLCs
- Connect with key organizations to explore incorporating IBCLC care into Accountable Care Organization maternal/newborn care services.
- Offer virtual webinars and education to members on a variety of practice related and pandemic-specific topics
- Continue to recruit more members to help with new committees and goals
